2 Recommendation

Com-Con International is the uber-convention for all things related to comics. It is also an excellent opportunity to network with book publishing professionals. This year more publishers than ever are attending, including Penguin, Simon & Schuster, W.W. Norton, and Warner. Of particular note is the Portfolio Review, a section of the convention where companies are allowed to set up for the sole purpose of looking at new work. In addition there are close to 300 events, including panels and seminars about comics, movies, television, animation, art, and more. Exhibitors include Fantagraphics and Tokyopop as well as the Cartoon Network and Sci Fi Channel; writers include Ray Bradbury and Brad Meltzer (Identity Crisis) as well as Daniel Clowes (Ghost World), and Yoshihiro Tatsumi (The Push Man). If you are serious about pursing a career in comics, Com-Con would be a smart investment of your time and money. Event #1: How to Write a Knockout Book Proposal

Most proposals are rejected not because the writing is weak, but because the writer failed to provide agents and editors with all the information they need. This is especially true

for fiction proposals. Topics discussed include: the true purpose of a proposal; why 90% of proposals are rejected based on the cover letter alone; and the three most common mistakes writers make when preparing proposals.

Event #2: Private Appointments

The first twenty writers to send a manuscript to Gemini Ink will each receive a 20-minute private consultation with Editorial Consultant Marcela Landres. Ms. Landres will offer suggestions and advice for each writer. Only the first twenty applicants will be notified; other manuscripts will not be returned.
